Chestnut Trail

This circular route follows the main tracks in this historic park with some sections across open grassland. It is mostly flat with a few gentle inclines.

Start point:
Warren Road entrance

Time:
Approximately 2 hours

Distance:
3.25 miles / 5.2 km



The Grotto, originally designed as an ornamental boathouse is a beautiful remnant from the past, and a fascinating example of 18th Century garden landscaping.



Chalet Wood is blooming with bluebells, a member of the lily family, in spring time. For just a few short weeks you will see their stunning colours.



You will see Heronry Pond, Perch Pond and Ornamental Water on your walk. Water bodies in parks allow beautiful views and encourage wildlife. Wanstead Park is London's greatest surviving designed historic waterscape.
